In September 2007, the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP) was formed to provide a more focused approach to our goal of ending homelessness within the County. The Partnership consists of city governments, community based organizations, faith-based organizations, educational institutes, non-profit organizations, private industry, and federal, state, and local government.

SBCHP was developed to promote a strong collaboration between agencies to direct the planning, development, and implementation of the County's 10-year-plan to end chronic homelessness. The Partnership meets on the third Wednesday of each month at the Behavioral Health Resource Center in Rialto. The Partnership facilitates better communication, planning, coordination, and cooperation among all entities that provide services and/or resources for the relief of homelessness in San Bernardino County.

***The Mission of the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership is to provide a system of care that is inclusive, well planned, coordinated and evaluated and is accessible to all who are homeless and those at-risk of becoming homeless.***

They are also hosting “homeless court” sessions at the Carnegie Library on the last Friday of every month.</li> <li>• Lorena raised ongoing concerns regarding resources to address housing and homeless challenges for community college students. She suggested that the CoC make college students a priority population.</li> <li>• Alice also expressed concerns regarding housing and homeless challenges for students as well as seniors. <p><i>Current Trends in Housing and Homeless Challenges Faced by People Experiencing Domestic Violence and Abuse</i></p>	<p>Walter Solorzano, House of Ruth, Inc.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• House of Ruth has been providing life-saving domestic violence services for residents of eastern Los Angeles and western San Bernardino counties since 1977. Participation in House of Ruth programming is open to all battered women, men, and their children. All of House of Ruth’s programs are free of charge.</li> <li>• House of Ruth recently received grant funding to conduct a Rapid Re-housing Pilot Project for DV survivor households. The pilot project includes 90 days of bridge housing and up to 6 months of rental assistance based on a Housing First approach and a Progressive Engagement model.</li> <li>• The program is available to single individuals and single parents with children under 17 who are homeless or at risk to homelessness and fleeing domestic violence. Participant must have a source of income or an ability to get one and “the mentality to become self-sufficient and independent in a short-period of time.”</li> <li>• House of Ruth’s Rapid Re-housing services include housing search and placement, housing stabilization case management, and rental financial assistance. Financial assistance include security deposit and first month’s rent paid in full followed by decreasing rental subsidies for up to 6 months. The program can also pay for up to 3 month of rental arrears. They also provide help with essential furnishings such as refrigerators and bedroom sets.</li> <li>• Supportive services include in-home visits, employment development, crisis intervention, domestic violence counseling, financial education, life skills education, landlord tenant right and responsibilities, transportation, and other community service connections.
