In September 2007, the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP) was formed to provide a more focused approach to our goal of ending homelessness within the County. The Partnership consists of city governments, community based organizations, faith-based organizations, educational institutes, non-profit organizations, private industry, and federal, state, and local government.

SBCHP was developed to promote a strong collaboration between agencies to direct the planning, development, and implementation of the County’s 10-year-plan to end chronic homelessness. The Partnership meets on the third Wednesday of each month at the Behavioral Health Resource Center in Rialto. The Partnership facilitates better communication, planning, coordination, and cooperation among all entities that provide services and/or resources for the relief of homelessness in San Bernardino County.

Mission Statement

The Mission of the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership is to provide a system of care that is inclusive, well planned, coordinated and evaluated and is accessible to all who are homeless and those at-risk of becoming homeless.

New project bonus funding is available for permanent supportive housing for chronically homeless and rapid rehousing for survivors of domestic violence. The Interagency Council on Homelessness will be holding three meetings this month including: a Strategic Planning Workshop on August 15th from 9:00am – 3:00pm, a Special ICH Meeting on August 23rd from 9:00am – 3:00pm to review and consider recommendations for the 2019 CoC NOFA Application and the regularly scheduled ICH Meeting on August 28th from 9:00-11:00am, all at the at the County Health Services Auditorium in Rialto. The 4th workshop on the San Bernardino County Multijurisdictional Homeless Action Plan was held on July 15th. Participants had an opportunity to review data broken down by region from HMIS, CES, HOPE Team and Pathways to Housing. A draft of the Multijurisdictional Homeless Action Plan will be presented at the ICH Meeting on August 28th. The All County Homeless Provider Network Meeting on July 9th included presentations from the ACLU on Land Use & Zoning Issues and Housing Justice in the Inland Empire and National Association on Mental Illness along with a review of the draft CoC CES Written Standards and information from the Multijurisdictional Planning Workshops. The HPN leadership has been meeting with representatives from the UCR Extension Program to develop a Homeless Support Specialist workshops series for the SBC Homeless Partnership, The June agenda packet for the Interagency Council on Homelessness includes data and information from the Coordinated Entry System. ICH Agenda packet available on the SBC Homeless Partnership website. America's Job Center will be holding a West Valley Regional Job Fair on September 26th from 9:00am – 12:00 noon at the West Wind Community Center, 2455 East Riverside Dr., Ontario. Save the Date – This year's 12th Annual Homeless Summit is scheduled to be held on November 6, 2019 at the Ontario Airport Hotel, 700 N Haven Ave, Ontario, CA 91764. The theme this year is "Creating Collective Collaborations: Homeless, Healthcare & Housing." A news article was shared on a proposal under consideration by the Governor's Homeless and Supportive Housing Advisory Task Force to enact a statewide legal "right to shelter" policy similar to that in New York City.

<i>"Introduction of New Affordable, Efficiency Housing Unit Prototype in San Bernardino County"</i>	Ruben Palagonia Oscar Cantillano	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ruben Palagonia is the owner and operator of The Masters Trailers, a custom builder of travel trailers for trucks and campers in San Bernardino. The Essential Living House Project incorporates the simple and efficient living space design of travel trailers to create a fully functioning, 10x10x10 efficiency living unit that can be used to create temporary housing for homeless individuals or even affordable rental units for limited income households. Larger sized efficiency units are also available for manufacture. These modular units can be constructed in a factory or in the field built to city code specifications, fully insulated with a washable interior surface, fire sprinklers inside, standard shingle roof, fully water-resistant exterior and no gas or propane required. They come with fully functioning sink, shower and toilet and fully furnished with a bed, small refrigerator, cooktop stove, microwave, vanity cabinet, closet space and breakfast table and chairs. The pre-constructed units are portable and can be moved from one location to another with minimal work. Up to 10 units can be placed on a single parcel of paved land with access to water, conventional or solar electricity and sewage and drainage capacity. Cost per unit dependent on volume of the order. 10 units for placement on a single parcel can be manufactured and cited for roughly \$11,000 per unit. A prototype is available for viewing at 110 S.
