Motion to Approve Minutes: Approval of Minutes for April 5, 2023, by Dr. Rene Keres, seconded by Anthony Brazier. Passed.

Jessica provided brief insight on Presentation from previous meeting: Presented by Kimberly Star, Inland Self-help United Way regarding Multi-year budget proposal of growing and changing needs. Five physical centers – unhoused to receive intake/referral. Dashboard training for tech-savvy individual to assist with 30-day window feedback from committee members/trainee(s). Anthony Brazier and Dr. Rene Keres accepted to take on this task. IEHP pushed to 2nd meeting – Workgroup names submitted.

Jessica, briefly explained HIPP and SHP housing and homeless incentive programs.

Presenter: Pastor Paul Jones shared information about his Benjamin E. Jones Community Resource Center, and Resource Services (H.E.L.P.E.R.S. – Helping Educate & Lead People Effectively to Resource Services), how he was drawn to this calling, and that the center is named for his father. Also, informed Committee of the need for other ways to assist with housing for misplaced individuals, low-income individuals, and seniors.

The Center services misplaced individuals in the San Bernardino area, in the various parks, going door-to-door in various senior citizen apartment complexes, and foster care agencies with the Kinder Care program, providing and offering their services along with their various Partners, the Department of Parks and Recreation, and Resource Center Volunteers. They have 16 booths, not including 10 booths at the Benjamin E. Jones Resource Center. Shared that they are not allowed to have more than 15 booths; Sandra Ibarra to assist with this.

Services:

1. **Feed My Sheep** - Weekly Food Programs
2. **Nautiqua's Closet** – Clothing Services
3. **H.E.L.P.E.R.S.** – Misplaced individuals Helping Educate & Lead People to Effective Resource Services

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4. **DMV** – Vouchers for free I.D.
5. **Healthy Seniors** – Food, Furniture, Hygiene Kits, Adult Diapers, Clothes, etc.
6. **School Supplies Giveaway** – Backpacks and school supplies
7. **Thanksgiving Basket Giveaway** – Annually for the past 5 years to families.
8. **Christmas Giveaway** – Makes every attempt to ensure no child is without toys for Christmas.

- **Thursdays** – Pass out fliers on 2nd Street.
- **Second (2nd) Friday** – Seniors work with Cal State University San Bernardino.
- **Third (3rd) Friday, 9:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m.** – Perris Hill Park: Showers ready by 9:00 a.m. Begin services 10:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m.
- **Fourth (4th) Friday, 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 Noon** – Seccombe Lake Park: Free Showers, Free food boxes.

- **Animal care** – Shots and chips for dogs
- **Phone** – Free Phones and phone charging
- **Testing** – COVID-19 Testing

Announcement of seats opening this summer to sit on the Board. PITC numbers are now out and ICH presented the numbers at the April 28th meeting. Protocol for letters of support will be announced soon. Do not wait till the last minute.

Approved minutes from last month's meeting: Dr. Renee made motion; Sandra Ibbara gave a second motion. Pass.

City updates: New project in Redlands for seniors that are low-income to be at the top of the priority. Colton will be adding a second food distribution. Grand Terrace is welcomed and now attending meetings. City of San Bernardino is waiting for ERF award, Outreach & Engagement team will be announced May 17th at city council. Mobile Shower expansion with CAPS to start in June. City is progressively moving forwards with phase 1 of the ES campus.

Homeless to Home program will come back with more detailed information.
