Attendees: SEE SIGN IN SHEET FOR ATTENDANCE

The Chair Jessica Alexander opened the meeting at 1:08 PM with introductions from attendees and provided two minutes for the attendees to get settled and obtain snacks and water provided at this meeting. She extended a thank you on behalf of the HPN to the City of Colton for setting up the meeting space and snacks.

Public Comment: Family Assistance Program announced internship opportunities for the Youth PIT Count, Youth Drop-In Center in Victorville, DV Shelter, re-entry program in Victorville & San Bernardino, as well as the reorganizing of the YAB (Youth Advisory Board), & job openings at FAP.

Tania Henry- announced that she received non-profit status for probation & parole transitional housing program. **Motion to Approve Minutes:** The minutes from October 4, 2023, with a motion to approve by Zazette Scott seconded by Charles. The minutes were approved with no opposition. **Passed**

Information Sharing/Updates:

Homeless Summit: audience was reminded that it will take place on Nov 8, 2023 at the University of Redlands.

- The summit is at capacity, but there is an active waitlist in case there are any cancellations.

New Central Valley Delegate and Alternate to Outreach & CES Committee: David Rabindranath of the City of Redlands is the official representative for Outreach & CES for the Central Valley Delegates.

HHAP 3 Training Updates- Presented by Anna Ulibarri: Jessica introduced Ms. Ulibarri who serves on the committee that helps ensure our region has input and receives its fair share of funding that's important to homeless services provided in the regions.

Anna debriefed the HPN, and reported upcoming training "Looker Report," HMIS Training coordinated by the Office of Homeless Services. Training outcomes will be reported to the CoC; this report will allow agencies to customize reports;

Anna announced the availability for Capacity Building Assistance (CBA) funding, an RFP will be released and promoted to encourage organizations to apply. The RFP will be launched in about 4 weeks, it was announced that there might be a pre-bid meeting.

The HPN Chair thanked Anna U. and introduced Aziza to present the Inland SoCal United Way 211 +.

Aziza provided an update on the Regional Access recently funded project: the project funded which will support homeless persons CES; Family Assistance Program and Paston Jones were the recipients of this funding and will be implementing the regional access, which is the first point of contact for a consumer entering the system. As a reminder:

Access points provide:

- Critical role in engaging people to address their most immediate need through referral services.
- Critical role in determining which interventions are applicable to rapidly connect that client to housing resources.

City Link "Values" presentation by Mark Nuami from Water of Life

- The presentation focused on the new housing development in partnership with the City of Fontana;
 - City Link will be adding 14 units
 - Site 1 "Bridge of Hope"
 - Site 2 "Olive Branch"
 - Provided updates for their housing projects, included case studies and success stories; volunteer
 - trainings updates & upcoming volunteer opportunities;
 - Mark shared recent & upcoming events, including the City of Fontana's plan to revitalize the city's downtown and that the location in which the city's revitalization will take place will be moved to a new location which will sit in a 4 acres land. Mark shared the blueprints with audience members and indicated that the opening date is earmarked for 8/24/24, this location will include 20 trailers as part of phase II. Plans for phase III include an outreach center

IE Rebound Presentation by Nia Hill & KS Casey

- Provided overview of programs which include re-entry services, transportation, and peer mentoring.
- Presentation included sharing of IE Rebound's mission, vision, and values
- Nia and KS Casey informed the audience of their "Brother's Keeper" mentoring program; outcomes, impact statements, and challenges faced by the program; which include the criminal system, and lack of housing.

Presenters shared and outlined the services that have been provided to clients, including case management, getting their participants document ready, family reunification, housing placements at locations where they can be housed from 30 days to 6 months; career/employment development, this includes assessments, resume building, mock interviews, etc.

Finally, IE Rebound shared they were the recipients of the BSCC grant provided by the State of California.






Central Region Coordinated Entry System Hub Office - Family Assistance Program

- 1. Persons in crisis calls 211 call center; 211 call center screens caller; completes a VI-SPAT on them.
- 2. 211 refers by email the caller to FAMILY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM or BENJAMIN E. JONES RESOURCE CENTER.




- 4. We upload HFV in HMIS. We place person on a Case Management List (Follow-Ups) and call weekly.... while trying to place them into shelter or housing.
- 5. We report weekly "new homeless" to 211, Office of Homeless Services & City partners.
- 6. We outreach "connecting" with shelters and housing to understand (1) their admission criteria and (2) bed availability and (3) plans to expand.

What have we learned - labor intensive to place a homeless person

Typical referral by 211 is a woman, City of San Bernardino

Multiple calls are needed to convert a referral to a verification

80% of referrals have been women - drug use and mental health issues

We are looking for a mental health partner for our homeless verifications







SBCWC History

- Formerly Central City Lutheran Mission
- Operating in San Bernardino since 1994
- Merge with LSSSC in 2015
- Provides services to include housing, education and health



Men's Shelter

- SBCWC operates a 30/60/90-day Men's Night Shelter
- Shelter Eligibility: Homeless verification/referral, male 18 years+, physically and mentally independent, No 290 criminal record
- Homeless Verification/Referrals can be completed by 211, Provider, Outreach, Hospital, SBPD, Parole, etc.
- Referral Submittal: <u>SBCWCreferrals@lsssc.org</u> or fax (909) 381-6921
- 70 Bed Barrack/Mass Shelter
- ADA Accessible
- Enrollments are by appointment only has Shelter has a waitlist.
- Full case management, meals, hygiene, clothing, transportation, support groups and other critical needs support provided.



Men's Homeless Shelter

Males 18 years and older

Must provide Homeless Verification in order to schedule Intake Appointment (if exiting an institution, you would use your release/discharge documents)

Intakes are by Appointment ONLY during daytime

We do not accept drop-off clients

All client must complete intake and check-in process



Permanent Supportive Housing

- SBCWC operates Permanent Supportive Housing for Chronically homeless PLWHA.
- 23 Beds
- Full case management, transportation, life skills education, critical support services
- Homeless Verification/Referrals can be completed by 211, Provider, Outreach, Hospital, SBPD, Parole, etc.





- SBCWC operates Transportation services for Elderly and Disabled individuals
- Appointments can be scheduled by Providers, Case Managers, Hospitals for their clients
- Services is Door to Door
- Appointments are first come first serve
- Vehicle is ADA Accessible
- Services are for employment, medical, health, legal, housing, education, case management-based services. Services are not accessible for social based needs.





Food Distribution Program

- SBCWC operates Food Distribution to community members
- Distribution is open on the 2nd and 3rd Friday of each month at 8:30 am.
- Distribution operates until supplies are gone
- No Identification or eligibility requirements. Individuals complete a sign-in form upon arrival.

Community Meals Program

- SBCWC operates Community Lunch Meal Service
- Open to All individuals
- No referrals/requirements
- Lunch Meal is Offered Tuesdays and Thursdays at 12 pm
- Meal Services will resume March 1st





Community Support Services

- SBCWC provides community support and resources to community members
- Referrals/Resources
- Identification Replacement Vouchers
- Birth Certificate Replacement Vouchers
- Social Security Card Replacement Vouchers


