Total clients being sheltered in all housing and motels – 34 (4 families in Motels)

Clients in Moronogo Basin with EHV- 1 individual 3 Families

Since October 2021 we have had over 120 requests and applications completed

for Emergency Housing Vouchers for San Bernardino County. 24 requests for

applications are from the Moronogo Basin – (13 are families, 11 are individuals)

Total HMIS clients since July 2021 – 208 clients for services in Moronogo Basin

(This does not include EHV clients who are not in a program)

(88 clients identify as Black – 42%

120 -clients are white or Asian or Islander)

(124 are female -59.6%

84 are males)

Comment – females with children or alone are more likely to seek help for shelter but men are more easily identify as homeless and seen on the street.
