Review of County actions on behalf of the Homeless	Wendel Wilson	<ol> <li>Items of interest:</li> <li>County's Strategic Action Plan: \$72 Million available to assist homeless services: I.e., \$15 million to support Grant application programs for six Regional initiatives; \$27 Million to expand Pacific Village for homeless (motel conversion); \$2.5 Million for Fern Street Adult Facility; \$4 Million for Project RoomKey—temp. beds, food &amp; lodging security; \$20 Million for housing: emergency, transitional, and interim housing; also \$12 Million from HUD for home allocation. We will be getting more clarification about ALL of these at the IHC meeting.</li> <li>Guidelines on what the Regional Steering Committee will be doing: RFP request/proposal for HHAP-3 dealing with several million each year with overlapping funding over 5 years. RoundTable/ Public Comment		Quintin — Rotary very helpful for DOVE in Big Bear. Housing-wise we have housed a few clients thanks to a grant from HUB (in partnership with Fam. Assist. Project) — a rapid re-housing grant for Domestic Violence victims. Difficulties encountered with clients needing to first qualify for rental agreements before we can assist. Long-term rentals are very hard to find due to the Air B&B rental take-over of the available housing. We are in process of applying for another transitional housing grant with more versatile funding. Grant funding is called "Master Leasing" (part of "Shared Housing") where WE lease the place and put folks into the place and they pay us (less that actual rent). We are renovating our pet shelter area in order to shelter Domestic Violence victims.  Wendell: MHC has been working with "Shared Housing" for the last year or so and we had a grant to lease a building and when we were talking to our clients there as a reluctance about sharing a house. Normally it's a large house to be shared by multiple clients and so it hasn't gone over real big yet. But the reality up here will probably force a more acceptance.  Sue O'Strander We are initiating our Community Visioning Efforts. Surveyors started connecting BB residents and property owners, so we will have an online survey. What the public is looking to for the future of BBLake, which will set the stage for the next phase which is the General City Plan process. Last one was 20 years ago. Overdue!  Wendell — Next month's meeting is May 8th with Presentation by Tania Johnson of Lighthouse Services
