Bear Valley Holiday Cooperative	Shonda Szabo (Bear Valley USD)	Re: Bear Valley Holiday Cooperative was Started about 20 years ago. Came into being due to duplication of gifts and dinners provided by different agencies to the same people, so to avoid that duplication, the Cooperative sets up one list and all agencies connect We serve btwn 200-300 families. There is a sign-up for the gifts so that we can know ahead of time the age, gender, name of each child. It was the Bear Valley School District that organized the Cooperative. This year the lead organization for financial donations also is the Lions Club.

Joint MIHPN+R	SC meeting—I	
		We usually have four interview dates to sit down with the recipients at different churches or agencies. Proof of residence so that we assure that we are helping just the folks of Bear Valley. Applications are entered into a data base. Clubs also fill requests from resident grandparents who want to give gifts to their off-the-mountain grandkids – those requests are filled last. Our main focus is to help our homeless students in the school system. Part of our interview is to clarify if people are doubled up living with others which classifies as homeless themselves. We have our different agencies and churches come together to decide which agency serves which family. The Lions' Club will deliver food. We track dietary requirements. We do a food drive at the school sites to prepare. Then organizations that provide food can come and select which items they would like to have. The organizations add fresh food items. People can also make monetary donations. Agencies that have helped: American Legion; Amer. Assoc. of University Women; Bear Valley Elec. Service donates gift cards; Citizens on Patrol, Soroptimists, St. Columba's Episcopal Ch., and several more. Covid reduced our numbers of request/families from 300 to 200. This year about 220. Questions: Annanieke: Can people from the community volunteer in any way. ANS: Best to go through one of the churches or other agencies. We do have to "clear" volunteers that are going to work directly with the children. Have to be concerned about confidentiality of our families. Each child receives three or four toys. Gary: Is there a place doing a free Christmas dinner in the Big Bear area? ANS: There are several doing Thanksgiving Dinners but not aware of Christmas dinner in the Big Bear area? Victoville has a shelter that allows our mountain folks to be sheltered. Sadly, we have NO shelters anywhere in mountains. <u>MountainHomelessCoalition.com</u> now has a newsletter you can access. Our helpline number is 909-713-4099 Sue: PITC (Point in Time Count) is Jan. 25. You can sign up anytime now at the County Office for Homeless. Any other sharing? Quinton: At DOVES we set up Santa's Workshop for clients to help their kids. Shonda: CDBG (Community Devel. Block Grant) grant in process – McKinney-Vento kids number 210 – higher than last years. More Spanish-Speaking families. Andrew Mellon: City of BBLake – any questions about CDBG grant or other needs, do call us. Gary: MHC is developing a program called "LaundroMATCH" to help our clients with laundry for free. Background checks need for volunteers.
