ACTION ITEMS	 The 2020 Point in Time Count revealed a 67.5% increase from 2017. One of the biggest increases was among accompanied women. CaSonya Thomas retired from her position as the head of the Community Revitalization Group. Her replacement is Supria Barrows. It was suggested by the Board of Supervisors that the mission to provide everyone with access to safe, affordable housing should be changed to something more attainable for the County. No updates on these changes have been provided at this time. Four Strategies: Implement system and policy changes to address the root causes of homelessness Increase permanent housing in San Bernardino County by 500 units in 2022 Expand homelessness prevention and housing programs Expand the range of support to prevent or provide early intervention to homelessness; provide services to 1,800 individuals/households Create healthy communities to improve quality of life for unsheltered individuals Increase the number of year-round temporary housing beds; create 100 new units of shelter beds in 2022 Continue to expand cooperation between systems to increase the use of data to improve programs Improve data integration and usability There are multiple funding sources available. All goals have to be matched up with funding. Committee formed to manage funding sources – Paul Fournier, Dawn Smith, Sharon Green, Dena Fuentes Interagency Council on Homelessness Next Steps Approve priorities from the five regions The County will issue a request for proposals for each region based on those priorities Vote on proposals
