Evaluator's Recommendations:

Based on the scoring and discussion, the evaluation committee recommends funding the top three applicants in following manner, contingent upon completion of the Financial Review and acceptance by the Interagency Council on Homelessness (ICH) Board:

- Family Assistance Program be awarded \$184,525.06.
 - Their coverage of the 12–17-year-old population was strongest, and we recommend some emphasis on this group. This project also provided coverage in multiple regions.
- Avector Community Group, Inc. be awarded \$184,525.06.
 - Their coverage of 4 regions including the East and West Valleys (but 18+ year old only) was strongest.
- Growing Outreach Growing Opportunities be awarded \$74,000 for Rapid Rehousing and Prevention.
 - Their coverage of a remote area of the county, including all TAY ages, was their greatest strength. Street outreach seems impractical for this large, remote region.

Should the ICH Board choose not to accept a recommendation for an agency, based on the Financial Review, the evaluation committee recommends funding the applicants in the following manner:

- Distributing the remaining funding equally among the remaining recommended agencies, not to exceed the agency's requested budget.
- Any funding exceeding an agency's requested budget will be disbursed to the recommended agency(ies) that have not met their requested budget.
